The ICFMH is offering a limited number of grants for attendance at FOOD MICRO 2010 Symposium in Copenhagen. Candidates should be under 40 years of age and either currently registered for, or having recently obtained, a higher degree (MSc, PhD or equivalent) and offering a poster or oral paper for any Session of FOOD MICRO 2010 or the associated Satellite Symposium on value-added traditional fermented foods (to be held on Monday 30th August).

The application should include:

- 1 A completed application form, which can be obtained from Dr Corry
- 2 A completed registration form which can be downloaded from the FoodMicro2010 website.
- 3 a short curriculum vitae (CV).
- 4 a copy of an abstract that has already been submitted, or alternatively an abstract for a poster or oral presentation on a topic related to the Satellite Symposium on value-added traditional fermented foods. In either case the abstract should include a full list of authors and their address(s). Total length (double-spaced, font 11 or 12) should not exceed one A4 page.
- 5 a signed statement from your Head of Department to confirm that the candidate is a postgraduate student or has recently obtained a postgraduate degree and
- 6 an estimate of the cost of return travel to the symposium.

Air tickets for successful applicants will be purchased by ICFMH, and the cost of registration and accommodation will be paid directly to the symposium organisers. A small grant for subsistence will also be provided by ICFMH on arrival in Copenhagen.
